

Respondents were asked to identify the student enrollment in their current school district. One hundred and forty-nine respondents (26.7%) reported an enrollment of under 500 students. One hundred and thirty-seven respondents (24.5%) reported student enrollment between 500 and 999 students. One hundred and seventy-seven respondents (31.7%) indicated student enrollment between 1,000 and 2,999 students. Fifty-nine of the respondents (10.6%) reported that student enrollment was between 3,000 and 5,999 students. Twenty-two respondents (3.9%) revealed that student enrollment was between 6,000 and 11,999 students. Fifteen respondents (2.7%) reported student enrollment figures of 12,000 and above (see Table 5).

Respondents were asked to identify the type of school district in which they were employed when they received formal superintendent mentoring; namely, an elementary district, a high school district, a unit district, or other. Of the 559 respondents, 52 (9.5%) had been employed in an elementary district when they received their formal superintendent mentoring. Thirteen (2.4%) of the respondents had been employed in a high school district when they received their formal
